STEAM

The students were very busy with hands-on explorations in STEAM for Quarter 3. Kindergarteners learned all about pushes and pulls which are forces. Through activities including bowling, wrecking balls, and ramps, students were able to grasp the concept of force and motion.

First Graders were lucky enough to have the Vanderbilt Planetarium visit us for an in-house trip to the moon during our unit of study on the Sun, Moon, and Stars.

Second grade learned all about solids, liquids, and gasses which are all states of matter. We even learned that some types of matter can have properties of more than one state, like Oobleck!

During the **third grade** unit on fossils, the students were able to go on a fossil dig, with the help of donations made by the Beymolla Family. The students identified fossils and were even able to bring one home.

Fourth graders learned all about sound. By exploring waves and wavelengths, we learned about patterns in terms of amplitude and frequency. Through the use of sound stations, like cup phones, palm pipes, and musical glasses, the students were

able to delve deeper into this topic.

To close out the school year, topics in various grades include but are not limited to animals, plants, energy, electricity, and engi-

What fun it has been learning Spanish this quarter! Students in **Kindergarten** made brown bear puppets to help them retell the story <u>Oso Pardo, Oso Pardo, Que Ves Ahi?</u> using animals and colors in Spanish. They are now learning a traditional nursery rhyme from Mexico called "De Colores" to sing about the springtime. Students in **first grade** have been learning the days of the week in Spanish. They read <u>La Oruga Muy Hambrienta</u> and are able to retell the story in Spanish about what the caterpillar ate on each day. Every class, we start off by singing the days of the week song along with our other favorites! **Second graders** learned the letters of the alphabet and vowels in Spanish. They are not able to ask someone how their name is spelt and spell their name in the target language! They are now learning how to express their emotions in more ways than just "bien." Students in **third grade** learned weather expressions in the target language. Students are "weather reporters" and have been completing a weather

forecast project about their Spanish-country of choice. **Fourth grade** celebrated the 100th day of school by writing one hundred words in Spanish, as a grade. We have been having fun playing games to learn numbers to one hundred in Spanish and have even been doing math!


